BUILDING PROJECT COMMITTEE WORK —

We are now at the three and one half month mark until our planned dedication on Shipwreck Sunday. Much work remains to meet our goal, however, during June we will see some dramatic activity. Most obvious will be the work on our organ and the removal of the stained glass in the Nave. Next, we hope to have the new well completed and work started on the new sanitation system. Our exterior of the new church should be done with the gutter and downspouts added. Stone work should also be completed along with the stucco. Our new steeple is built and the new cross has been received. These should also be put in place during June. All that will remain is the final grading of soil and the landscape work of New Leaf. Our interior work of painting and staining should progress well, although it will not be finished during the next thirty days. Electrical work will take the most time with the wiring in the sanctuary for lights still to be done. Once inspected, the sanctuary dry wall can be installed and painted. The new flooring for the building will be the final installed piece. After that is completed, we will have a scheduled cleaning time and a moving day for the pews and other items from the current church. This summer time is going to be the “home stretch” (to use a racing term) for our work. Please continue to keep our workers and our project in your prayers. We have been blessed by God and to him is the glory.

CALL TO ORDER:

Tom Marquart, Chairman called the Semi-annual meeting of St. Paul Evangelical Lutheran Church to order at 10:17 a.m. Pastor Edmiston offered an opening prayer.

APPROVAL OF THE ANNUAL MEETING MINUTES:

Gary Wilson moved, seconded by Elaine Ingram to approve the Annual Congregational Meeting minutes of November 18, 2012 as printed. Motion carried.

FINANCIAL REPORT (Tom Marquart):

The following balances as of March 31, 2013 were:

Current Checking Acct.	\$ 31,520
Building Fund	\$191,317
Current offerings were	\$19,045 above budget
Total expenses were	\$61 over budget

Heating was low for the past year, and snow removal was the lowest it has ever been.

BUILDING PROJECT FINANCIAL UPDATE (Craig Durliat):

As of March 31, 2013:

- We have collected approximately \$501,000 in pledges
- The first 3-year period of pledges are \$834,000
- When putting the budget together we were looking to collect \$7,000 per month, we are currently collecting approximately \$8,500 per month
- We borrowed \$300,000 in February
- Current balance in building fund is \$50,000 – \$60,000
- We will need to borrow another \$500,000 in May, our original plan was to borrow \$1,200,000 by June, 2013, we are \$400,000 less than projected

BUILDING PROJECT UPDATE (Mike Ingram):

- Mike thanked all involved, volunteers for time and effort, and everyone for financial support
- On schedule for dedication Shipwreck Sunday, September 15, 2013
- The new chairs for the fellowship hall arrived May 3, 2013
- The general contractor will finish soon
- The stone application on the outside is ready to begin
- Hoping gutters and downspouts will be done this week – May 6, 2013

- Progress is being made on the stucco (drivit)
- Exterior committee has done a great job with coordinating colors, etc.
- Talked with EPA and inspection team from Bowling Green
- Still waiting to hear approval for well drilling site
- Moving top soil in the north east quadrant so sewage system can be installed
- Had one small leak in the roof on the crown at the very end of the educational wing, which has been fixed
- Drywall is progressing nicely
- Marty Grieser has pulled 7,500' of wires for the sound system
- Preparations are being made for the organ pipes to be moved
- Merritt VonStein answered the following question – “When is the projected moving date?”
 - The septic system has to be hooked up – projected sometime in June
 - We have to have an Occupancy Permit which requires restrooms done, water hook-up, electric hook-up and all has to pass inspections
 - Will hold services in the multi–purpose room to start
 - Sanctuary will be the last area to be finished
- After the second wedding in June, the three primary stained glass windows in front will be pulled (it will take three months to restore and should be ready for the dedication), shortly after the circles will be pulled and Jaime Siferd of Bigelow Glass will be refurbishing them (the circles probably will not be ready for dedication Sunday)
- Once they start moving the organ pipes we will be going to all piano for Sunday services
- We will have an organized moving day later in the summer
- There is an outside door in the front of the sanctuary for emergency exit
- Trusses all have hurricane straps
- All doorways are 36” wide
- We are 100% American Disability Act compliant
- Openings of the existing stained glass windows in the old church will be covered after the windows are removed
- The Interior Committee has selected the floor coverings, decorative lights, can lights, sconces, etc.
- The educational wing and fellowship hall will all be fluorescent lighting
- All are invited to come and visit the new church any time
- Will continue to update the congregation weekly in News of the Flock

Tom Marquart thanked the committee and volunteers for all of their work.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:51 a.m. with the congregation praying together the Lord’s Prayer.

Hospital Stays

It is important to the church that we support you through illness and hospitalizations. If you are admitted to Blanchard Valley Hospital for an overnight stay we would like to know.

If you are planning an admission to any hospital, please call the church office at 419-326-3535 to let us know the date you are entering and how long you anticipate staying.

At admission to BVH, *planned or unplanned*, you (or your spokesperson) will be asked several questions,

1. Religion: this may be asked at pre-registration or at admission along with your address, phone number, etc. Please give our denomination.
2. If you wish to be on the Hospital Directory and the Religion List. These questions will be asked of you (or your spokesperson) during the “Consent to Treatment” process. Please answer “yes” to both.

In order to protect your privacy the hospital does not routinely call the church to tell us you have been admitted, unless you specifically ask them to call us. We depend on you or your family to let us know if you have been admitted.

If you have been in the hospital for a day or two and have not been visited, please ask your family or nurse to contact the church office.

A new federal law greatly restricts the disclosure of patient information by hospitals. As a result, the pastors and church office may not know that a member of the church has been admitted to the hospital. If you are

hospitalized and would like to notify the pastor, it is important that you or a member of your family inform the church office as soon as possible at 419-326-3535 and the secretary will contact the pastor.

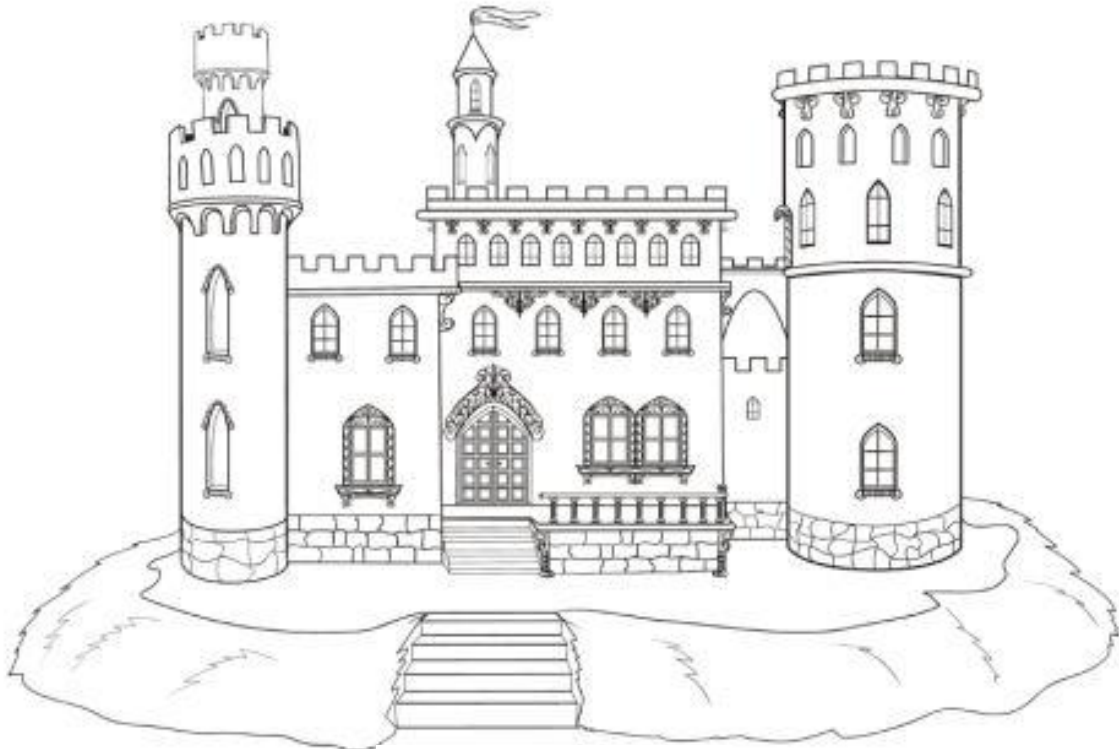
