BUILDING COMMITTEE UPDATE —

Praise God from who all blessings flow! We are now within three weeks of Dedication Sunday and all appears to be on schedule or close to it. Floor coverings are done except for some floor transitions and the final areas to be covered with the acrylic finish. Kitchen counter tops are expected to be installed starting this Friday. E.P.A. Approval is expected later this week as verbal approval was indicated last week. Work on the asphalt will begin August 27th and (weather permitting) should be completed in two days. Door, window, and base trims continue this week.

Organ installation continues with the goal of completion within two weeks. Ceiling insulation should begin to be blown in starting this week. Insertion of the stained glass panels and completion of the fire alarm system should also be done this week.

We will begin cleaning and moving on Saturday, August 31st at 9:00AM and should be completed no later than 12:00 noon. The kitchen will be the area we are most concerned about as we will have to install door pulls after the counter installation and only then can we clean. If we are unable to work in this area due to a delay, we will schedule another work time for this area.

Pastor Steve's books will still need to be moved as well as Jane's office. These areas will be effected greatly if we have not been given the OK by our structural inspector this week. Please keep a close watch on the e-mail communications line Friday. We will let you know if we have to re-schedule due to completion/inspection difficulties.

Please continue your prayers for our successful completion to this amazing and joyful undertaking.

FINANCIAL REPORT: (Jennifer Griggs)

- Jennifer distributed written copies of the financial report which listed checks written in July as well as account balances of July 31, 2013.
- Total in the checking account as of July 31, 2013 is \$257,010.74 (Current \$25,007.00; Building \$222,814.45; Improvement \$1,290.34; Missions \$4,535.00; Special Projects \$3,363.95.
- Current income for July, 2013 was \$14,240.77. Current payouts for July, 2013 were \$17,896.98.
- Building Project income for July, 2013 was \$3,953.00. Building Project payouts for July, 2013 were \$141,398.51.
- Mission income for July, 2013 was \$220.00. Mission payouts for July 2013 were \$0.
- Improvement income for July, 2013 was \$125.00. Improvement payouts for July were \$0.

TRUSTEES' REPORT: (Natalie McClelland)

- Steve Reichley inquired about the Crates Memorial Fund for his daughter Rachael.

PASTOR'S REPORT: (Pastor Edmiston)

Hospital Stays

It is important to the church that we support you through illness and hospitalizations. If you are admitted to Blanchard Valley Hospital for an overnight stay we would like to know.

If you are planning an admission to any hospital, please call the church office at 419-326-3535 to let us know the date you are entering and how long you anticipate staying.

At admission to BVH, *planned or unplanned*, you (or your spokesperson) will be asked several questions,

1. Religion: this may be asked at pre-registration or at admission along with your address, phone number, etc. Please give our denomination.
2. If you wish to be on the Hospital Directory and the Religion List. These questions will be asked of you (or your spokesperson) during the "Consent to Treatment" process. Please answer "yes" to both.

In order to protect your privacy the hospital does not routinely call the church to tell us you have been admitted, unless you specifically ask them to call us. We depend on you or your family to let us know if you have been admitted.

If you have been in the hospital for a day or two and have not been visited, please ask your family or nurse to contact the church office.

A new federal law greatly restricts the disclosure of patient information by hospitals. As a result, the pastors and church office may not know that a member of the church has been admitted to the hospital. If you are hospitalized and would like to notify the pastor, it is important that you or a member of your family inform the church office as soon as possible at 419-326-3535 and the secretary will contact the pastor.


Kelly and Vera’s Choirs (Children’s Choirs) will start practices on Wednesday, September 11th from 6:00PM – 6:30PM.
